Extra-Curricular Opportunities

The school offers a wide array of extra-curricular opportunities including local, national and international trips. These include French Work Experience opportunities in Paris, through to ski trips and exhibitions at local events.

Our clubs provide sporting and performing arts opportunities ranging from trampolining and football, to choreography and performance in a range of disciplines. Our instrumental lessons cover all traditional and non-traditional instruments and, with the support of the County Music Services, tuition and practice in most instruments can be supported.

Students also get to participate in the working of the school with a Senior Student Team made up of elected Sixth Form students, as well as opportunities through our College system for younger students to develop their leadership skills and contribute to school decisions.

Pastoral Support and Community Links

The school's College System, whereby the students are divided into four vertical groupings made up of students of all years, generates a family feel within the school population and provides younger students with support from older peers, and older students the opportunity to act as a mentor.

The school takes an active and ever increasing role in the local community, from participating in town events to encouraging students to actively support charitable or community projects, such as working with Guide Dogs or Government Bodies. Our students have consistently won recognition and awards for their involvement in such activities.
